WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Q: My coworkers and I have been debating the death penalty and whether or not it should be part of our justice system. Why are so many people who claim to be pro-life believers in favor of it?

A: The issues of crime and punishment are never easy because so many factors influence people and how they view problems and solutions. Increased violence, loss of life, cost to taxpayers and the community at large, and the maneuverings of lawyers and courts only add fuel to the fire. When bad things happen in your neighborhood or to your home or to you, you want relief. Any normal person would feel that way. A pro-life view does not insulate anyone from the bad effects of criminal behavior. Innocent people are hurt every day and it may seem as though those who cause the pain get away with it, or get off easy.

The death penalty is not excluded by Church teaching. The state has the right to impose penalties that are commensurate with the crime as well as to defend itself from further harm (Catechism of the Catholic Church, §2266). When possible, punishment should help correct the offender, offering a chance of redemption, which is why the pope and bishops have called for an end to the death penalty. GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE (Mathew 21: 28-32)

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you." Ouch. This had to sting. Jesus spoke these shocking words not just to anybody. He spoke them to "the chief priests and elders of the people." The ones who were professional law-keepers. The ones who were religious leaders and teachers. The ones who were, in truth, self-righteous, pompous, and presumptuous. Jesus must have known how offensive it would be to his audience to share this unpleasant fact. But he said it anyway because he knew they needed to hear it.

But the point wasn't to offend. The point was to AMEND. Jesus was urging them to change their lives for the better, to come to God with a humble, contrite heart, seeking forgiveness and mercy. These unrepentant upper-crust leaders were plagued by an inability to see their own sins. They were far too focused on identifying where others were going wrong. And, as was his style, Jesus' preaching was adapted according to his audience. These guys needed to get knocked out of their complacency. So Jesus did what he had to do.

It's important to realize, by the way, that the reason tax collectors and prostitutes were leading the line to heaven wasn't because of their sins. It was because of their sorrow. The people Jesus had in mind when he mentioned this--like Zacchaeus and Mary Magdalene perhaps--had repented from their sinful behavior and begun anew. This is why he praises them. And this is what the Lord longs to see everyone doing, including us. Either we need to acknowledge and repent of our sins, or we are placing ourselves in the same category as the pharisaical priests and elders. And that's definitely not the place to be.



MOST REVEREND MICHAEL R. COTE, D.D

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The month of October is Respect Life Month and Sunday, October 1, is Respect Life Sunday. The theme this year is "Be not afraid."



On hearing these words one immediately thinks of St. John Paul II and his inaugural homily (Oct. 22, 1978) where three times he encouraged the faithful to "Be not afraid." The message continues with Pope Francis who is calling the church to "Be not afraid" and take Christ to the margins of society. "Go. Do not be afraid and serve" was the central message of his homily at the final mass of World Youth Day in Rio, 2013. The message was repeated last year at World Youth Day in Krakow where he exhorted the young people: "Don't be afraid to say yes to him (Jesus) with all your heart, to respond generously and follow him!"

What I am saying today is "Be not afraid" of the church's beautiful teachings on life. "Be not afraid" is the message to communicate to the person considering an abortion. "Be not afraid" to bring that child into the world. The unborn child is cherished, loved and wanted by a large community. "Be not afraid" to share the incomparable dignity and worth of every human being to all whom you meet. Now, more than ever, Pope Francis is encouraging us to "Be not afraid" of the stranger, the migrant, the refugee who is created in God's image and likeness. "Be not afraid" if you have experienced an abortion or participated in an abortion. Hope and healing is possible through the great mercy of God.

"Be not afraid" of suffering. Christ unites Himself to those who are sick and suffering and you can find meaning in the sufferings of the passion of Jesus. No one is alone. Physician Assisted Suicide is still being promoted under the guise of words like "Aid in dying" or "Death with dignity." It is a sign of an age that lacks hope that these means of ending a life are being promoted. The elderly and the disabled are the most vulnerable to efforts at bringing Physician Assisted Suicide into the medical profession.

"Be not afraid" is essentially a message of joy. Our Lady at the Annunciation and the shepherds in the field were both greeted with joyful messages of hope from an angel. St. Joseph, in a dream, was told "do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home." You and I are to be messengers of hope and joy to a country facing a growing epidemic of opioid use. We are to be angels of mercy to share our food with the hungry, clothe the naked, and visit the imprisoned. In short, we are to be witnesses that life is beautiful from the first moment of conception to natural death. As St. John Paul II said in The Gospel of Life: "The Gospel of life is for the whole of human society. To be actively pro-life is to contribute to the renewal of society through the promotion of the common good. It is impossible to further the common good without acknowledging and defending the right to life, upon which all the other inalienable rights of individuals are founded and from which they develop."

Thank you for all you do for life in the Diocese of Norwich and "Be not afraid" to bring the good news of the gospel to everyone you meet.
