WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Q: On many Sundays, especially during Advent and Lent, we hear a reading from one of the prophets. What is significant about them for us? Didn't Jesus fulfill all their predictions?

A: Lent and Advent are the times of the church year when the prophetic word forms an important part of the liturgical season. Isaiah, Jeremiah, Baruch, and Zephaniah are just some of the prophets who offer powerful and essential lessons for Christians of any era. Prophets do not predict the future. They are very much concerned about the present, calling Israel to follow once again the word of God.

The prophets witness to a life of faith. In the midst of an intense relationship with God, the prophets are very aware of their unworthiness to embrace this call from God and struggle to accept the mission God entrusts to them.

The prophets speak on behalf of God. Each testifies that the word spoken is not from them but from God. At times, this lands them in trouble with their audience. Jeremiah, for example, felt betrayed by God as the prophetic message was delivered. People did not like the message because of their sin-filled lives, and their displeasure was taken out on the prophet. While tempted at times to "throw in the towel," the prophets remained true to the life of faith and persevered in the proclamation of God's word. In modeling these virtues and calling us to greater fidelity, the prophets offer an example and message that are still important to us today.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I remember growing up in Catholic school and having to make construction paper Advent wreaths every single year! The little yellow flames would be cut out and held until each new candle was lit. Great idea, except for the fact that the chance you could find the flames greatly diminished as each week passed. I will bet over 50% of the wreaths never received a 4th flame! Of course by then, most kids in elementary school had moved on to Christmas. Christmas was not a day. It was an entire experience of vacation from school.

You may or may not have an Advent wreath in your home or office, but those flames are rather insignificant to the flame that should be burning in our hearts during this season. How are you finding ways to light your fire? How are you preparing the way for Christ to come into your life and the lives of those around you in a more profound way?

The ritual of an Advent wreath is a good idea for anyone. But don't think that your preparations are done simply because you have one. You are called to be a flame to others during this season, reminding them of why we celebrate this time at all. Each person is a candle to be lit, and you have the gifts, given to you by God, to light them. At Christmas, you want God to look at you and see all the light generated by those He lit through you. Now is the time. Don't wait until Advent is almost over. You might not be able to find your own flames if you wait too long.

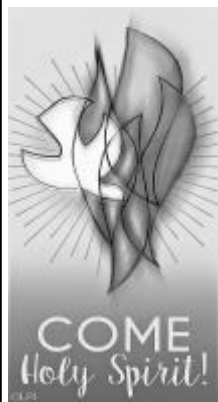

Please learn from my experience:

Had an early phone call from son Mike the other morning. He
sounded like he had a bad cold, cause I had difficulty understanding who
he was. But I have hearing issues too. He said that he was in jail be-
cause while using his cell phone he had hit the car in front of him and
that the passengers were sent to the was allowed this one phone call. He
then transferred me to the "attorney on duty" who informed me that Mike

scams is to let everyone know. Hence this account. I had heard of simi-
lar distress calls beginning with "Grandma", but I always knew I wouldn't
fall for that because my name is "Granny". But when son calls and says
"Mom, this is Mike" it's pretty believable and calls for immediate action. I
was suspicious all along, but kept telling myself "but I talked with Mike", it
never occurred to me that it was an imposter. The state trooper said no
pickup, no Brinks truck. It would be maneuvered so that I would wire the
money....that was their only goal.

Long story, but it has been an upsetting episode and at the same time
one that makes me grateful for (1) my wonderful Webster banker, Darcy,
and (2) the poor police who are basically helpless, as are we all. Except
as below.

Michael has a great idea. We allthroughout the whole family will
keep a code word :such as "bulldog", which would be a simple but fail-
safe ID. I asked our resident state trooper what he thought of the code-
word idea and he said it was a great idea and that they would incorpo-
rate it in their future presentations.

And so I urge you-all to take the short amount of time to get your family
code word set in stone in their memories.

Here's another short "code word" story:

Fox News: "Arizona girl, 11, stops would-be kidnapper by asking for
'code word,' police say."

Think of the damage we could do to these scammers with such a simple
tool.
